Zero. It is a number of insignificance, but at times it can mean much. Today, zero represents the number of Finish Thompson employees that have been laid off, the number of regular hours worked per week that Finish Thompson has reduced, and the percentage of wages and salaries that have been cut at Finish Thompson in 2009. In the last year, nearly 6 million jobs were lost in the United States as the unemployment rate reached almost 9.0 percent with our sector, manufacturing, being one of the industries hardest hit. Despite these dreary statistics, despite having to pay a record sum in taxes, despite preparing for yet another above-inflation rate increase in health insurance costs, Finish Thompson held steady its employment levels and pay rates and its ability to offer a solid 40 hours of work weekly to its associates. In talking to others in our industry and outside our industry, this is not the norm. Zero is a number Finish Thompson should be very proud of.

Equally significant in this difficult economy, Finish Thompson continues to make a **sound profit**. This profit will be reinvested into new products, more modern manufacturing capabilities and more dynamic sales tools so that we remain competitive and efficient in the face of the global market challenges. Profit is the seed of future successes and as we enter the summer months, we are mindful of the impact on our profit that may come from the looming extended factory shutdowns planned this summer in many of the markets Finish Thompson serve. We will be conservative going forward to ensure that there is profit at the end of the year for investment energy.

The results of Finish Thompson's **past investments** were recently on display at theACHEMA 2009 tradeshow in Frankfurt, Germany. This show, held every three years, may be the preeminent chemical equipment show worldwide. For many years, Finish Thompson attendedACHEMA, but this May we were pleased to participate for the first time in order to highlight the number of products and technologies we've designed and released over the past few years. Products on display were the nearly complete DB Series, the completed SP Series, the new variable speed MV drum pump motor, as well as a preview of a new medium-capacity drum pump series Finish Thompson plans to release before the end of this year. Besides highlighting new products,ACHEMA provided an opportunity to connect with many of the overseas distributors responsible for Finish Thompson's **rapid growth in export sales**. Over thirty Finish Thompson colleagues attended a brief seminar we put on during the week of the tradeshow. The focus of the seminar was details of our new products and future strategic plans. We are looking forward to repeating our participation atACHEMA 2012 where we expect to display the fruits of this year's investments.

New Drum Pump Motors Now Available

On April 1, 2009 FTI announced the addition of new motors to our drum pump line. The motors, M3V, M5V and M5V-US, are loaded with useful features and designed to work with our PF, TB and TBP Series pump tubes. The powerful 650-watt, 10,000 rpm maximum speed motor contains an electronic speed control that allows the customer to precisely regulate the fluid flow. The variable speed feature is provided at no extra cost (unlike competitors who offer variable speed at an extra charge if it is available at all).

The unique tool-free attachment method makes motor installation quick and easy. It also enables one motor to power multiple tubes since the motor can be quickly moved from tube to tube. Other features include double wall construction for reduced noise and vibration, a CFD designed labyrinth downdraft cooling system and internally mounted ON/OFF switch and circuit breaker.

The new motors are in stock and ready for shipment.

New PFS Head Design

Our engineers are always on the lookout for ways to make existing products better. Starting this month, you will see a new design for the PFS head. The PFS is the 316 stainless steel pump in our popular PF Series drum pump product line. Using powerful, advanced CFD (Computational Fluid Dynamics) software, the PF head has been modified to enhance flow characteristics and also give it a new look. The precision investment casting process allows for part geometry impossible to achieve through traditional machining processes.

Ceramic Bushing Option Eliminated

FTI has discontinued the ceramic bushing option for DB22 and SP22 Series products. The ceramic bushing has been replaced by a new silicon carbide bushing and shaft option (a complete silicon carbide package is also available). The new option is labeled "Ss" in the part number matrix. If you have questions, please contact FTI sales.
